seem to be more protective – she's 4 pounds of mighty mutt!



# FIND OUT A BIT MORE ABOUT THE BENJAMIN PROJECT

You may have noticed information about The Benjamin Project in the newsletters over the last few months. We wanted to know a bit more about the project, so we had a chat with Malcolm Bernstein, one of the project's founders.

### 1. What is The Benjamin Project?

The Benjamin Project is a nonprofit initiative whose mission is to educate children about responsible pet ownership and animal stewardship, as well as to raise funds for animal shelters and rescues.

### 2. Who was Benjamin?

Benjamin was our family's dog for 13 wonderful years. We adopted him from the OSPCA in 2000 at the age of approximately 18 months. He was a beautiful, friendly, athletic, smart, sentient being who brought incredible joy to us and to everyone he met – 2- and 4-legged!

# 3. You have published two books about Benjamin, including a children's book in 2018. Why did you want to expand beyond these initiatives to help rescues and shelters?

Helping rescues and shelters has always been at the core to our efforts, given Benjamin's history. I think these are such important organizations run by incredible people, and we want to do whatever we can with the proceeds from the books to help them.



# 4. What is your message to people, and how do you get the message out?

I present on Benjamin's life to "kids of all ages," from young children in schools to seniors in residences. Everyone loves the story and receives a Benjamin Booster certificate. My message is that animals are sentient beings and deserve our love and respect and that pets must be taken care of responsibly. In addition to presentations, I speak at fundraising events, issue a newsletter, print and sell an annual calendar, and promote The Benjamin Project on my website, thebenjaminproject.ca, our Facebook page, and partner websites.

### 5. Why did you decide to partner with Speaking of Dogs Rescue?

Speaking of Dogs is a wonderful rescue doing such great work. I am particularly attracted to its focus on helping senior dogs, whom my heart goes out to. Lorraine, Kim, and everyone involved work so hard, and we feel privileged to be partnering with you.

### 6. What can our readers do to help?

They can buy my books about Benjamin, introduce me to schools,

libraries, companies, child and family groups, social service clubs, and other venues where I can present, and spread the word through their networks. In addition to advancing our educational efforts, all funds raised through book sales to your readers and their networks will go to Speaking of Dogs in full.

# Speaking of Dogs Rescue is 100% run by volunteers. We are currently seeking a volunteer who meets the following criteria:

- Lives in Toronto
- Able to fulfill a commitment to the auction from start to finish (from now to November)
- Able to volunteer a few hours per week from now until mid-October, after which the commitment will increase to about 1 hour per day, until the start of the auction
- Works well independently but also with a team of people (both virtually and occasionally in person)
- Is well organized and able to use Excel and Google sheets
- Has good communication skills
- Able to receive and store about 70 auction items (a space around 5 feet x 7 feet will be needed, depending on the donations)
- Able to measure these items, log them in a spreadsheet, and photograph them (although a volunteer photographer could also be provided, if needed)

The auction project manager will provide guidance, and the other team members have worked on the auction for several years and know the process very well.


