## STEP UP FOR THE PUPS!

Want to help homeless, needy dogs? All you have to do is go for a walk!

We've decided to proceed with our STEP UP FOR THE PUPS fundraising event again this spring despite COVID restrictions being lifted. We've taken in an unprecedented number of dogs so far this year - over 80 dogs already!



We recently took in a shepherd/hound mix from a GTA shelter named Ginger Snap and we got her ultrasound results on Monday. She has a heart condition called Patent Ductus Arteriosus (PDA) which is a birth defect. She needs surgery to close the duct - we are being referred to Guelph by our veterinarian. Over the last year, we've helped many dogs with your generosity including Baker and Sally, who both came to us heartworm positive. Chico, a little terrier mix came in with an untreated eye infection that resulted in an eye enucleation. Jojo, a German Shepherd dog came to us unspayed and only days later, needed to be rushed to the emergency clinic because she suffered a life-threatening condition called Pyometra. We took a number of Mennonite puppy mill moms last summer. Snowbelle, Joanne, Sophie, Ariel, Julie and Dazzy all needed to be groomed, spayed and have extensive dental surgeries. Lainey, a lovely collie retriever from Northern Manitoba needed a mass removed and Milo, also from Northern Manitoba, came to us with a fractured pelvis.

Rocky, a lovely Bernese Mountain dog mix, came to us with a bad ear infection and despite many vet visits, the vets could resolve the infection; in the end, he required an ear ablation, a surgery that removes the entire ear canal.

In February, we took four dogs from a breeder closure: Lucy, Lana, Nora and Pippa who were all "doodle" breeding moms - and each one needed to be groomed, spayed, dewormed, have bloodwork done and dental procedures.


So far this year, we've seen more owner surrenders than ever before, and shelter requests come to us almost daily.




